
**Book Discussion Groups for all ages**




**Tuesday, May 16, 4:30-5:15 p.m.**



An annual Rose Festival, reigned over by a Rose Queen, was first suggested by music teacher and writer Dr. C.F. Nagro in 1960. The first annual Rose Festival and Pageant was held that year. Anne Marie VanderWerf, center, was chosen Rose Queen of 1960. Betty Chlapaty, left, was first runner-up and Majorie Olofson, second runner-up. Roselle was officially proclaimed the "Village of Roses" in 1961.
