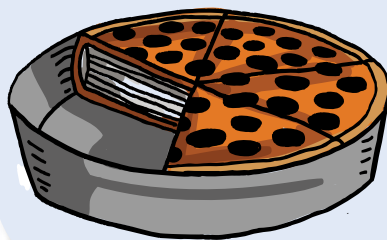


Adult Services

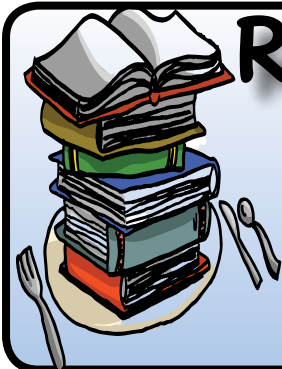

Adult and Family Reading Programs
June 4 through July 31

You must be a Roselle Public Library Cardholder to participate.

Family Reading Program

Each registered family member must read 3 books. Non-reading members may have books read to them. All books must be from the RPLD collection or downloaded from our eMediaLibrary link. They must be read during the program period and recorded before the program ends. Each member of a family that completes the program will receive a completion prize and each finishing family will be entered in the Grand Prize Giveaway. A 'family' will consist of at least one parent, grandparent or guardian plus one or more children under 18. Books should be age appropriate.



Adult Reading Program

Each registered adult must read 5 books. Downloadable eBooks and audiobooks are allowed. One book must be from the bibliography provided or be of similar subject matter. All materials must be from the RPLD collection or downloaded from our eMediaLibrary link. They must be read (or listened to) during the program period and recorded before the program ends. A book store gift card and a book will be given to finishers. Finishers will also be entered in the Grand Prize Giveaway. An optional book review of one of the five completed books may be submitted for entry into a special prize drawing. An 'adult' must be 18 years old.
